### Architectural

The house is a salt box style home. This is unique for the area because there was not a lumber company close by. The salt box style home was common for lumber towns because it was cheap housing for the workers that the owners supplied. The salt box style consisted of one to two story homes, minimum amount of windows and very ordinary exterior. The house has been covered in a board and batten fashion over a vinyl siding in the past 2 years (Fig 3). A steel roof has replaced shingles. The house contains the original chimney of the house as well as the original windows (Fig 1). An addition has been added onto the back of the house which provides more room for the occupants because the salt box style homes does not provide a lot of room (Fig 2).



## Historical

Wilfred Morrison was the son of James Morrison, a prominent figure in Craighurst during the early nineteenth century. James Morrison came to the Craighurst area from the Island of Jersey, off the coast of France. In 1840, Morrison held the first tavern in Craighurst, he also built the first mill there. Morrison also started the first line of stages along the Penetanguishene Road and became the government contractor for the improvement of the road northward of him. Wilfred Morrison came to Waverley at an older age and retired here. He stayed close to his roots but did not contribute like his father had done in the neighbouring village.
