Architectural

Built in an original board and batten fashion, the house has the style of an upright and wing home. It consists of a single upright portion and a wide wing protruding from the upright portion. The house was bricked in red brick in 1910. The home was bricked as it was easier to maintain and brick was not a special commodity any longer. It has since been sided in white vinyl siding. The original brick can still be seen on the chimney in Fig 3. The house has very steep, high peaks that would have been built to allow snow and ice to fall off without having to get on the roof (Fig 1). A small addition has been added to the rear of the home (Fig 2). It is a mud room of sorts for the present family and leads into the kitchen.

Historical

The original portion of the home was built in 1900 by William Livingstone Sr. The house has been with the Livingstone family since then. William and Emma Livingstone built the home a year after they bought the property. The property was used for farming and the house was not the main concern when it was built. This is why the house was not bricked until later but rather just had board and batten siding. The property and home was bought by William and Emma's son, William Jr. William Jr. and his wife, Ena took the family farm and continued farming until William's death. In 2001, the house was bought by a grandson and his family, Shane Whitehead.
