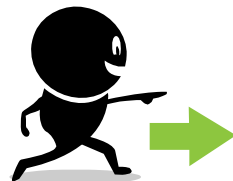

Recently Read and Recommended: The calling by Inger Ash Wolfe.

I'm not usually a mystery reader, but this is actually a novel of suspense. What appealed to me about this book was that it takes place in Ontario, in fictitious Port Dundas, and the vivid description of the local landscape. It reminds me of so many small communities north of us. I empathized with the lead character, a 60ish detective inspector named Hazel Micallef. She has all the physical and emotional baggage associated with someone that age. A serial killer leads an interesting chase throughout Ontario, Quebec and even into New Brunswick. The suspense continues with the identity of the author.

Inger Ash Wolfe is actually the pseudonym of a well-known North American writer of literary fiction. Who could it be? I hope this is only number 1 in a series. Reviewed by Janice Waddell
