THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TAY

BY-LAW NO. 2014-27

Being a by-law to prescribe reduced load periods for Township roadways.

WHEREAS Subsection 7 of Section 122 of the Highway Traffic Act (R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8) as amended provides that the municipality or other authority having jurisdiction over a highway may by by-law designate the date on which a reduced load period shall start or end and the highway or portion thereof under its jurisdiction to which the designation applies.

AND WHEREAS the reduced load period is deemed necessary for the protection of certain roadways in the Corporation of the Township of Tay.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TAY ENACTS AND BE IT ENACTED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the definition of "road" in this by-law includes a common and public road, street, avenue, drive, driveway, parkway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle designed and intended for, or used by the general public for passage of vehicles.
- 2. That the definition of a "reduced load period" in the by-law shall mean a reduced load period within the meaning of Section 122 of the Highway Traffic Act.
- 3. That all roads within the Township of Tay over which the Corporation of the Township of Tay has jurisdiction are hereby designated as being subject to the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of this by-law shall apply to all roads within Township of Tay except:
 - a. Triple Bay Road, Highway 12 to Talbot Street;
 - b. Gratrix Road, Highway 12 to Fesserton Side Road;
 - c. Park Street, Highway 12 to Richard Street;
 - d. Industrial Road, Park Street to East Limit;
 - e. Mill Road, Industrial Road to North Limit;
 - f. Richard Street, Park Street to Albert Street;
 - g. Albert Street, Richard Street to William Street;
 - h. William Street, Albert Street to Highway 12;
 - i. Talbot Street, Triple Bay Road to Highway 12.
- 4. That the provisions of Subsections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Section 122 of the Highway Traffic Act shall apply to all roads within the Township of Tay, during the period from the 1st day of March to the 30th day of April, inclusive, in each and every year.

- 5. That the Director of Public Works or their designate may, in any year, at his/her discretion, extend the load restriction periods.
- 6. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this by-law, the Director of Public Works or their designate may, pursuant to Section 110(1) of the Highway Traffic Act upon receiving an application in writing, issue a permit for the moving of heavy vehicles, loads, objects or structures in excess of the weight limits permitted during the period in which reduced load designation is in effect.
- 7. This by-law shall not be enforced until the appropriate period, and all signs have been erected and are on display.
